


## Reentry Organizations in North Carolina: A Resource for Employers

February 2023

Interested in second chance hiring, but not sure how to connect with justice-involved people who are ready to work? One starting point is connecting with non-profits and other organizations that help justice-involved people reintegrate with their communities and gain employment. In this resource, we've collected a list of entities doing this work. Our list is divided into two parts: entities providing services statewide and entities providing services in specific counties. Our list may not be comprehensive, so consider asking other second chance employers in your community how they connect with justice-involved people. If you know of other organizations not included on our list, please reach out with that information.
