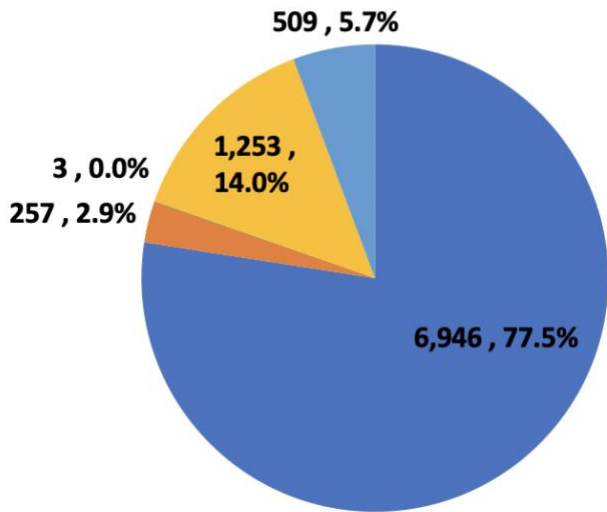


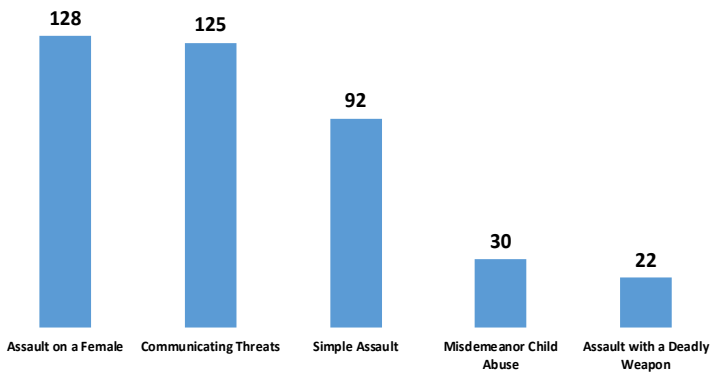
77.5% of Anson County misdemeanor charges were for nonviolent and non-DWI related traffic offenses, 14.0% were for other nonviolent offenses, 2.9% were for DWI and related offenses, 5.7% were for violent offenses, and 0.0% were for nonviolent ordinance violations.

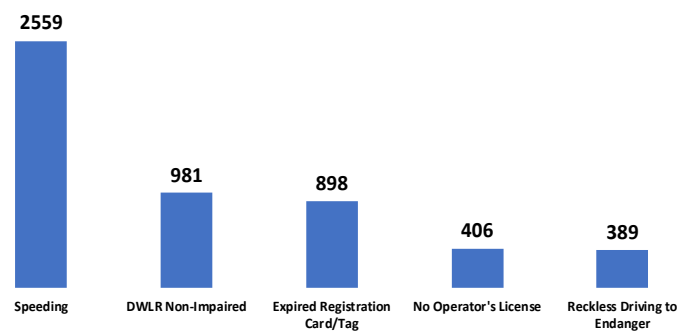

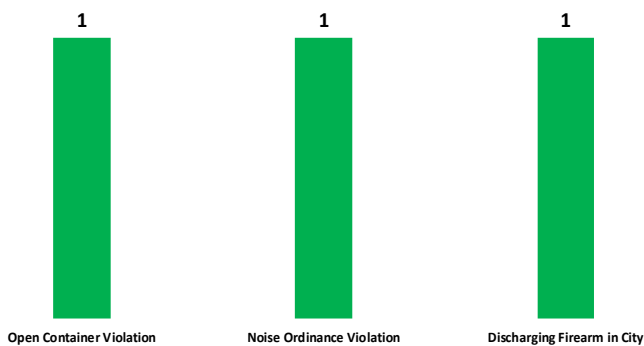
#### Most Commonly Charged Violent Misdemeanors



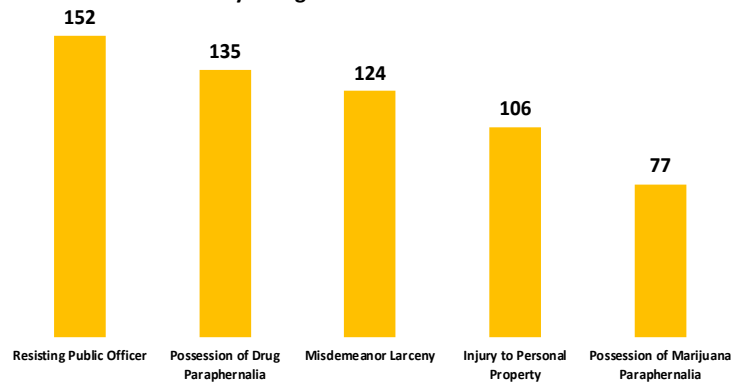
#### Most Commonly Charged Non-DWI Related Traffic Misdemeanors



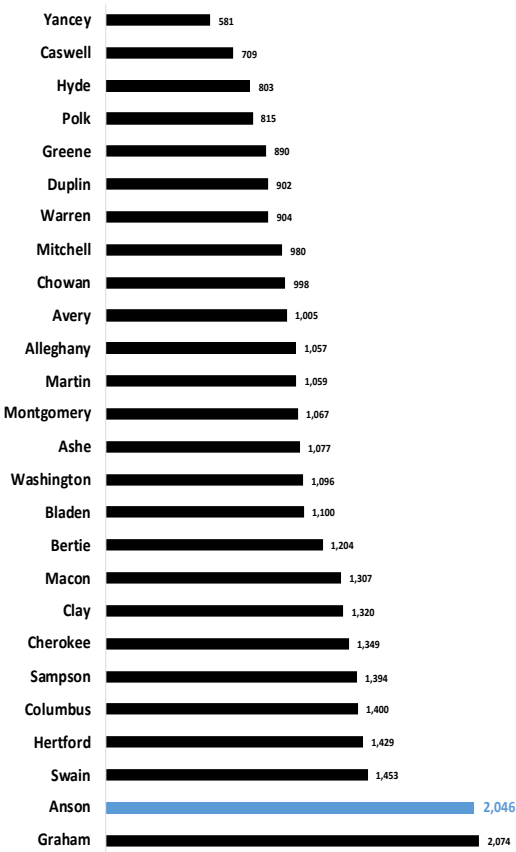
#### Most Commonly Charged Ordinance Violations



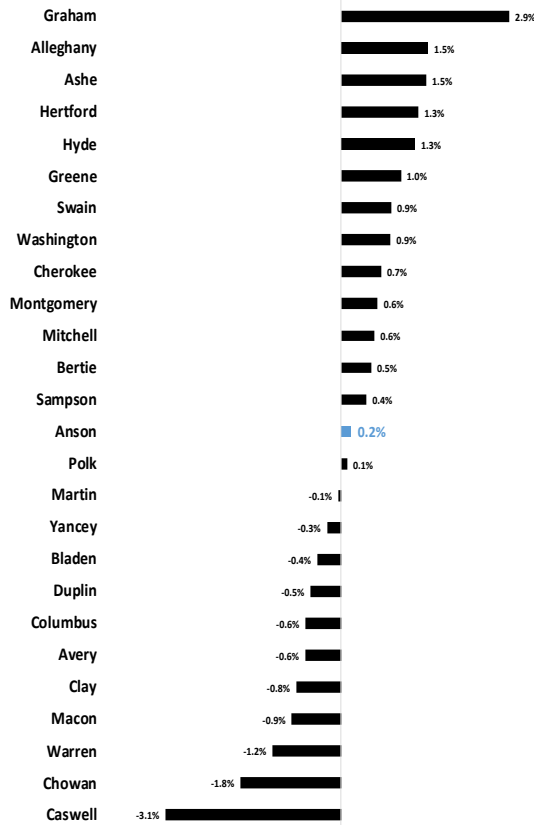

2019 Violent Misdemeanor Charges Per 100,000 Population Among Noncore Counties

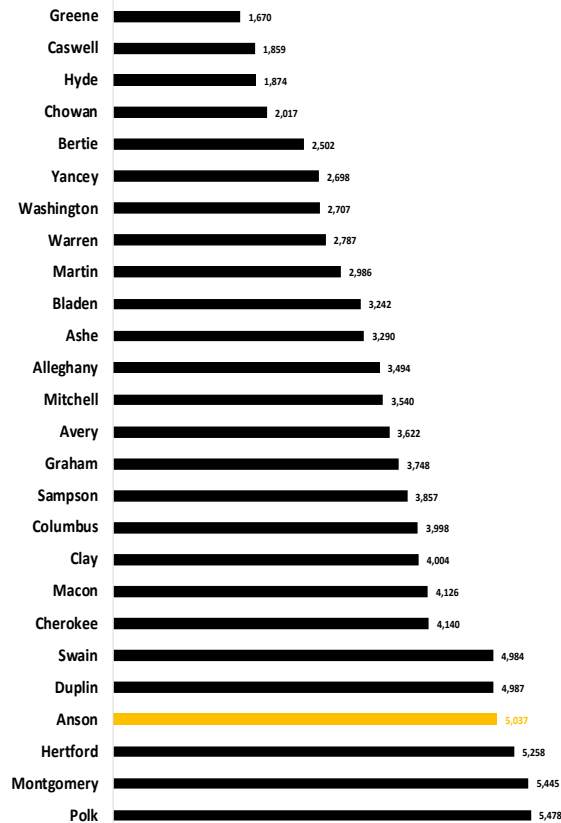


2018 - 2019 Change in Percentage Violent Misdemeanor Charges Among Noncore Counties

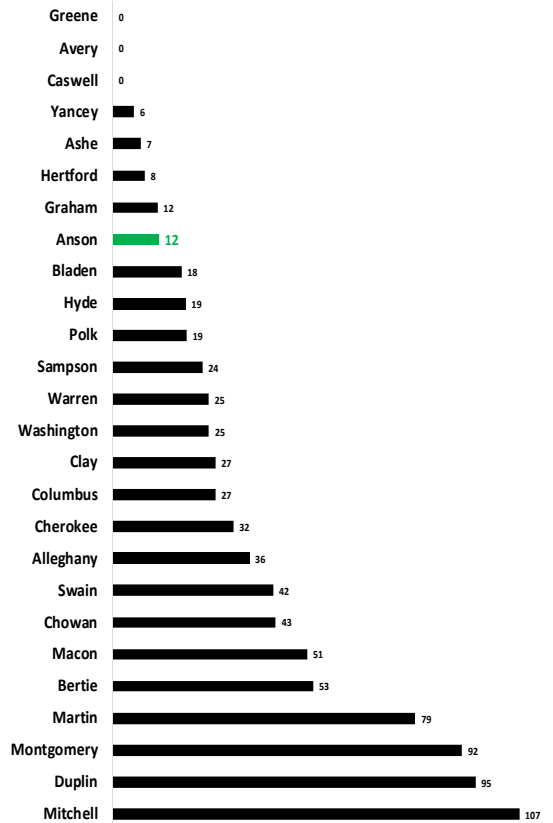


Among noncore counties<sup>1</sup>, Anson County had the second highest number of violent misdemeanor charges per 100,000 residents in 2019 at **2,046**. Between 2018 and 2019, Anson County had the 14<sup>th</sup> largest increase in violent misdemeanor charges among noncore counties at **.2** percentage points.

2019 Ordinance Violation Charges Per 100,000 Population Among Noncore Counties

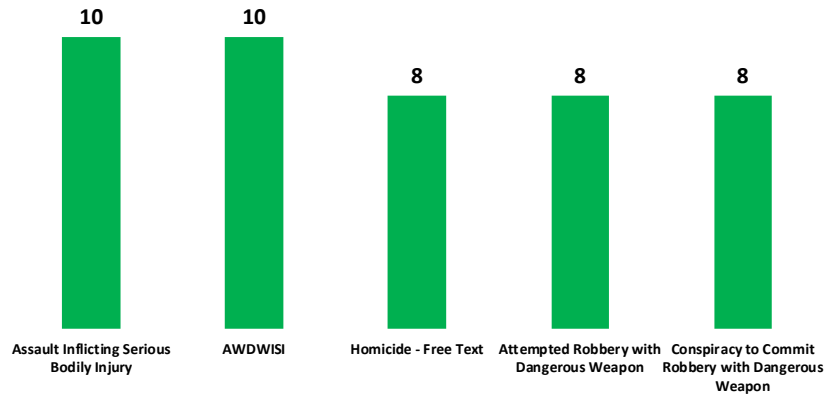


Among noncore counties<sup>1</sup>, Anson County had the fourth highest number of other nonviolent misdemeanor charges per 100,000 residents in 2019 at **5,037**. Anson County had the seventh lowest number of ordinance violation charges per 100,000 residents in 2019 at **12**.

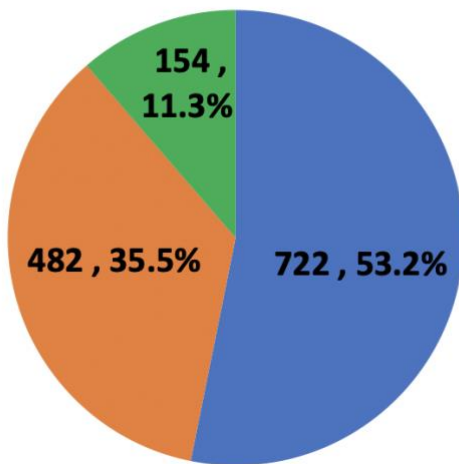

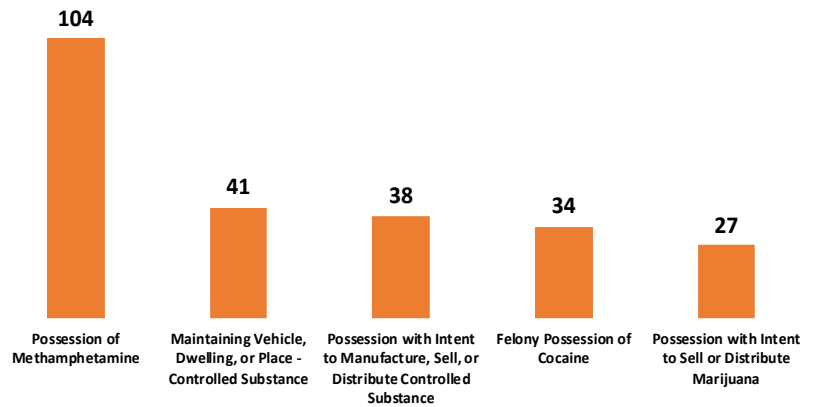
Most Commonly Charged Violent Felonies



2019 Charged Felonies

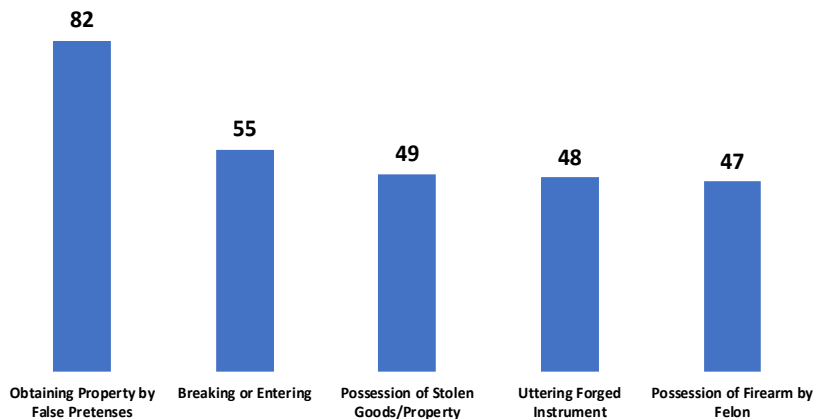


Most Commonly Charged Drug Felonies



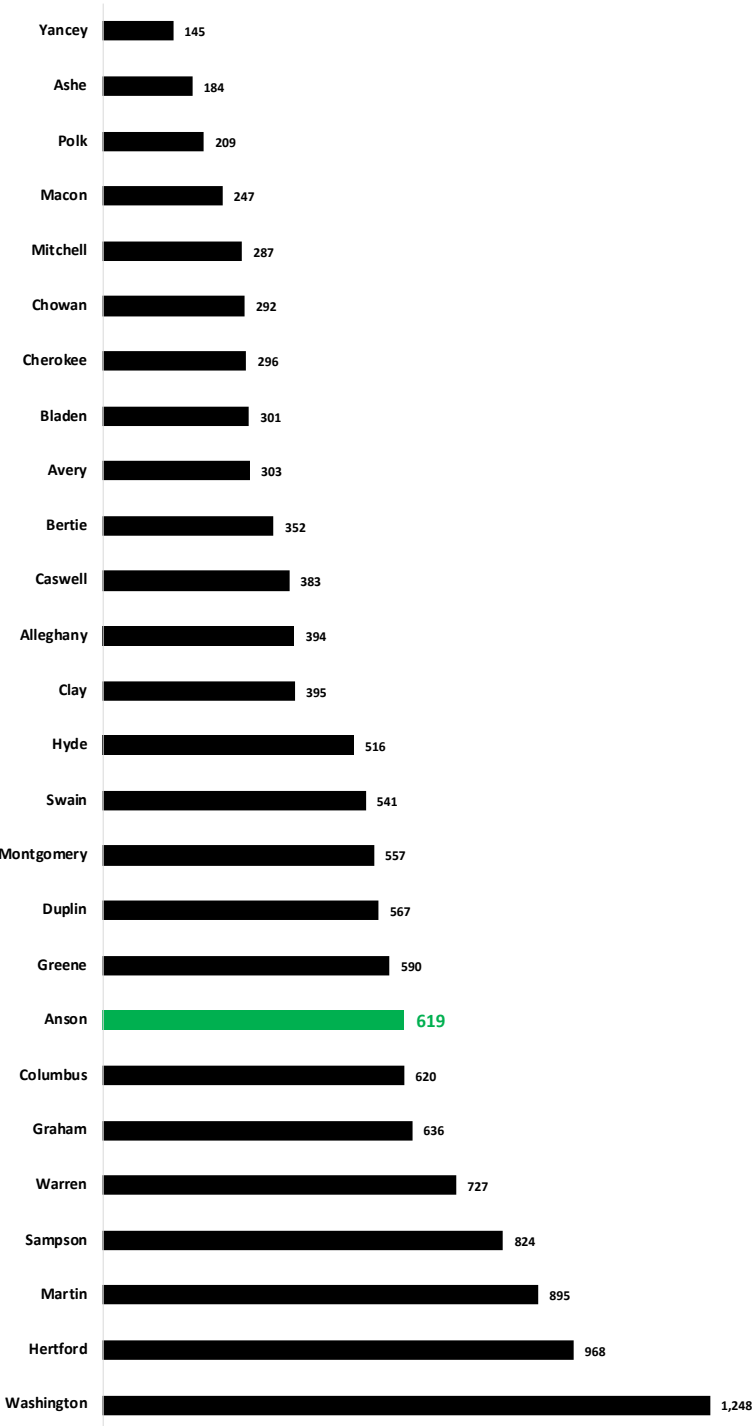

Most Commonly Charged Other Nonviolent Felonies

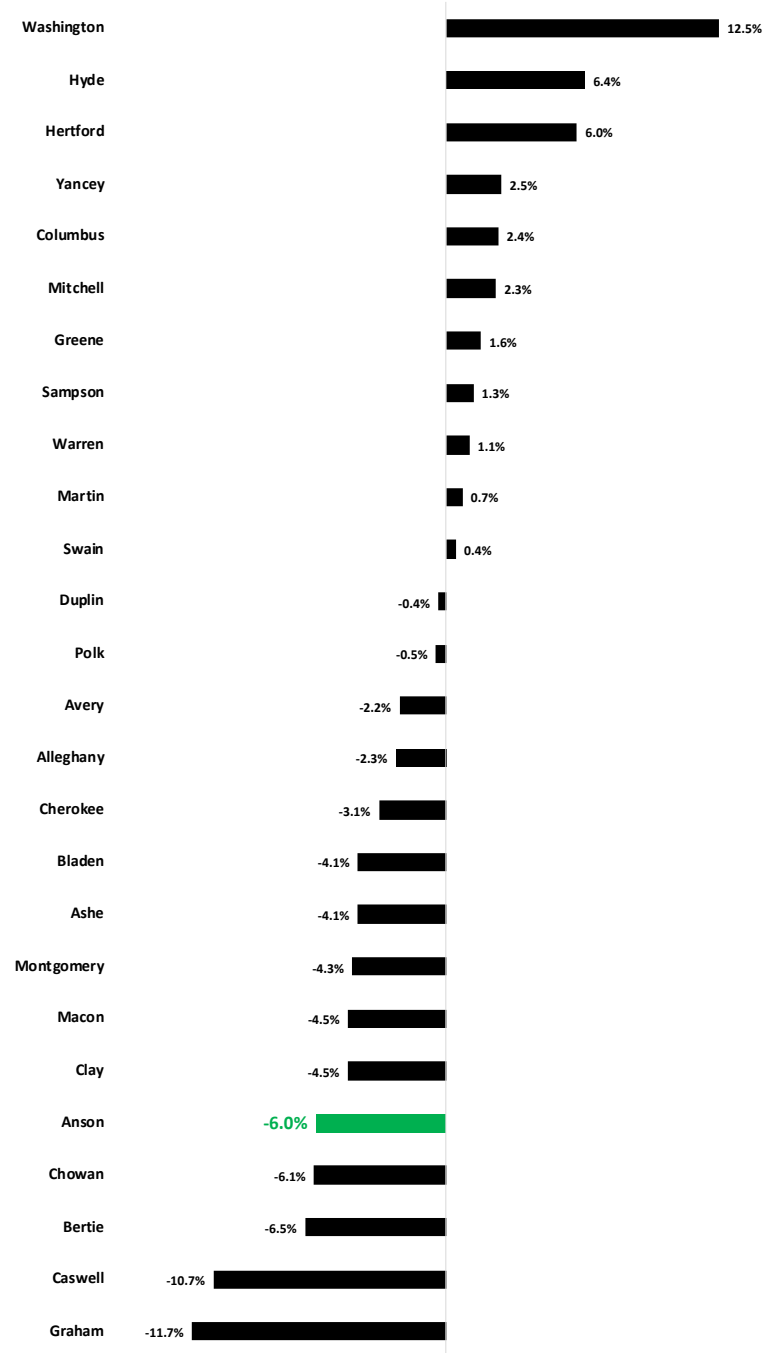


Among noncore counties<sup>1</sup>, Anson County had the eighth highest number of violent felony charges per 100,000 residents in 2019 at **619**. Between 2018 and 2019, Anson County had the fifth highest decrease in violent felony charges among noncore counties at **6.0** percentage points.
