



**72.3**% of Johnston County misdemeanor charges were for nonviolent and non-DWI related traffic offenses, **17.1**% were for other nonviolent offenses, **5.8**% were for DWI and related offenses, **4.8**% were for violent offenses, and **0.1**% were for nonviolent ordinance violations.




**Most Commonly Charged Violent Misdemeanors** 




Most Commonly Charged Non-DWI Related Traffic




**Most Commonly Charged Ordinance Violations** 




**Most Commonly Charged Other Nonviolent Misdemeanors** 






Among large central and large fringe metro counties<sup>1,2</sup>, Johnston County had the sixth lowest number of violent misdemeanor charges per 100,000 residents in 2019 at **819**. Between 2018 and 2019, Johnston County had the ninth largest decrease in violent misdemeanor charges among medium metro counties at .01 percentage points.

Among large central and large fringe metro counties<sup>1,2</sup>, Johnston County had the sixth lowest number of other nonviolent misdemeanor charges per 100,000 residents in 2019 at 2,919. Johnston County had the second lowest number of ordinance violation charges per 100,000 residents in 2019 at 10.









Among large central metro counties<sup>1</sup> and large fringe metro counties<sup>2</sup>, Johnston County had the sixth lowest number of violent felony charges per 100,000 residents in 2019 at 428. Between 2018 and 2019, Johnston County had the fifth largest increase in violent felony charges at .5 percentage points.
