


**72.7%** of Vance County misdemeanor charges were for nonviolent and non-DWI related traffic offenses, **14.4%** were for other nonviolent offenses, **6.0%** were for DWI and related offenses, **6.6%** were for violent offenses, and **.4%** were for nonviolent ordinance violations.

#### **2019 Charged Misdemeanors**




■ Nonviolent, Non-DWI Related Traffic Misdemeanor Charges














### 2019 Violent Misdemeanor Charges Per 100,000 Population Among Noncore Counties


#### 2018 - 2019 Change in Percentage Violent Misdemeanor Charges Among Noncore Counties




Among micropolitan counties<sup>1</sup>, Vance County had the third highest number of violent misdemeanor charges per 100,000 residents in 2019 at **2,012**. Between 2018 and 2019, Vance County had the 12<sup>th</sup> largest increase in violent misdemeanor charges among micropolitan counties at .4 percentage points.

Among micropolitan counties<sup>1</sup>, Vance
County had the 14<sup>th</sup> highest number of other nonviolent misdemeanor charges per 100,000 residents in 2019 at 4,408. Vance County had the fifth highest number of ordinance violation charges per 100,000 residents in 2019 at 114.







## 2019 Ordinance Violation Charges Per 100,000 Population Among Noncore Counties








19.3% of Vance County felony charges were for violent felonies, 33.9% were for nonviolent drug felonies, and 46.8% were for other nonviolent felonies.





#### **Most Commonly Charged Other Nonviolent Felonies**



Among micropolitan counties<sup>1</sup>, Vance County had the highest number of violent felony charges per 100,000 residents in 2019 at **1,240**. Between 2018 and 2019, Vance County had the fifth largest increase in violent felony charges among micropolitan counties at **4.4** percentage points.
